NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

NOTE 1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Organization

Mission Granbury, Inc. (the Organization), a community-based non-profit organization, was founded to provide a community response to domestic violence and families in crisis for all Hood County Residents.

The major sources of funding of these activities are: (1) federal grant proceeds, (2) contributions received, and (3) net proceeds from special event programs.

Basis of Presentation

Financial statement presentation follows the recommendations of the Financial Accounting Standards Board in its Statement of Financial Accounting Standards (SFAS) No. 117, *Financial Statements of Not-for-Profit Organizations*. Under SFAS No. 117, the Agency is required to report information regarding its financial position and activities according to three classes of net assets: unrestricted net assets, temporarily restricted net assets, and permanently restricted net assets.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

For purposes of the statement of cash flows, cash and cash equivalents consist of cash in banks, certificates of deposit, and all highly liquid investments including restricted cash balances with original maturities of less than three months. Money market accounts held at brokers are considered investments.

Investments

Investments are stated at fair value as determined by quoted prices. All investments consists of money market accounts and equity securities whose fair value was \$11,178 at December 31, 2007.

Investment Income, Gains and Losses

All realized gains and losses arising from the sale, collection or other disposition of investments are accounted for in the net asset class that owned the asset. Unrealized gains and losses are reflected in the accompanying financial statements. Ordinary income from investments and other income producing assets is accounted for in the net asset class owning the asset.

NOTE 1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES – CONTINUED

Grants and Contracts Receivable

The Organization has not provided an allowance for doubtful accounts for grants and contracts receivable based on a review of accounts and past experience. All amounts are due from governmental agencies under expense reimbursement grants. At December 31, 2007 approximately 55% of the receivables represent amounts due from one agency. In addition, approximately 63% of total grant revenue is from two agencies.

Property and Depreciation

Property acquired by Mission Granbury, Inc. is considered to be owned by the Organization. However, State funding sources may maintain equitable interest in the property purchased with grant monies as well as the right to determine the use of any proceeds from the sale of these assets. The State has a reversionary interest in those assets purchased with its funds which have a cost of \$1,000 or more and an estimated useful life of at least two years.

Property is recorded at cost, except for contributed assets, which are recorded at their estimated fair value at the time of contribution. Disbursements for maintenance, repairs and improvements which do not extend the useful lives of the assets are charged to expense as incurred.

Depreciation is calculated using the straight-line method over the following estimated useful lives:

Buildings	30 years
Building improvements	10 years
Furniture, fixtures and equipment	5 years

Contributions

All contributions are considered to be available for unrestricted use unless specifically restricted by the donor. Pledges for contributions to support current operations are recorded as received. Donor-restricted support is reported as an increase in temporarily or permanently restricted net assets, depending on the nature of the restriction. When a restriction expires (that is, when a stipulated time restriction ends or purpose restriction is accomplished), temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified to unrestricted net assets and reported in the Statement of Activities as net assets released from restrictions. Contributions whose restrictions are met in the same reporting period are reported as unrestricted contributions.

NOTE 1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES – CONTINUED

Contributions – Continued

Non-cash contributions of assets are recorded at the appraised or estimated fair value at the date of contribution. Contributed services that create or enhance non-financial assets or would typically need to be purchased if not contributed, require specialized skills and are provided by individuals with those skills are recorded at fair value.

Donated Services

A substantial number of volunteers have donated significant amounts of time to the Organization's activities. However, the Organization only recognized donated services that create or enhance non-financial assets or that require specialized skills, are provided by individuals possessing those skills, and would typically need to be purchased if not provided by donation.

Fund-raising Activities

The Organization conducts various fund-raising activities including an enchanted gala auction. The expenses incurred in conducting these activities with other fund-raising costs are shown in the financial statements under the caption "Fundraising."

Advertising

Advertising costs are expensed as incurred. Advertising costs for the year ended December 31, 2007 totaled \$13,015.

Income Taxes

The Organization is a nonprofit organization that is exempt from income taxes under Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c)(3) and is not considered a private foundation.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements under accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements, and the reported amounts of receipts and disbursements during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

NOTE 1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES – CONTINUED

Temporarily Restricted Net Assets

Temporarily restricted net assets represent contributions for which donors have imposed restrictions. These restrictions require the Organization to use such funds for various activities related to the Capital Campaign project. Net assets released from restrictions represent program restrictions that were fulfilled during the year, represented primarily by the release of funds used in the construction of the shelter.

Functional Allocation of Expenses

The costs of providing the various programs and other activities have been summarized on a functional basis in the accompanying statement of activities. Accordingly, certain costs have been allocated among the programs and supporting services benefited.

NOTE 2. CONCENTRATIONS

The Organization maintains its cash in bank deposit and brokerage accounts which, at times, may exceed federally insured limits. The Organization has not experienced any losses in such accounts and believes that it is not exposed to significant credit risk on cash.

NOTE 4. COMPENSATED ABSENCES

The Organization has accrued \$9,662 in compensable absences as of December 31, 2007. The Organization's benefit plan allows for accrual of up to one year's benefit, which is payable to the employee upon termination provided that the employee gives at least two weeks written notice.

The Organization leases its business offices and office equipment located in Granbury, Texas. Total rental expense for the year ended December 31, 2007 was \$29,674.
